

- One of key figures of Kansas Vortex – Conner/McClure/Hopper/Snyder/Haselwood/Branaman/Pewther who moved to San Francisco in the 1950's and who were instrumental in starting Batman Gallery.
- San Francisco Bay area poet and playwright Michael McClure was among the first generation of Beat poets and writers. Along with another former Beat poet, Gary Snyder, McClure is recognised as a key figure in the development of a literature and culture animated by feelings for the environment and with commitment to ecological activism.
